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Welome to the 130th Annual Aitkin County Fair!

This Guide is dedicated to the Open Class areas of the Aitkin County Fair. This Guide will allow exhibitors to choose and ready their exhibits long before the publication of the regular Aitkin County Fair Book.

Throughout this guide are suggestions, hints, and guidelines for getting the best out of your exhibits along with instructions on how to enter. There are 19 Departments, 245 Divisions, and 2,379 Classes in which to display your talents.

New in the Creative Activities area:

Two Departments have been eliminated – Senior Citizen (Age 55 and over) and Special Living Individuals (nursing home, group living individuals, special needs, etc.). However, the divisions and classes from these departments have been incorporated into the other regular open class Creative Activities departments along with the regular divisions just for Juniors. In addition, there are special divisions for those who feel they have gone beyond the amateur stage, but have not quite reached what they consider to be “Professional” called the “Artisan/Craftsman” division in many of the Open Class Creative Activities departments. See #9 in General Rules.

Early Registration/Entry Day:

The Monday evening before the official entry day of the Creative Activities exhibits is available for those individuals who have not pre-registered and would have liked to do Same-day entry but are unable to do so on Tuesday, as well as for those individuals who have pre-registered but would have liked to pick up all tags and pay all fees so they can just drop off the tagged items on Tuesday, saving time. Those individuals who have preregistered in the Livestock areas may pay all the fees that would have been due on Wednesday also and is recommended. Early entry livestock entries can also be made.

Horse Department:

All open class horse entries must be pre-registered using the email: horsedepartmentacf@gmail.com (See the instructions in Department 1 – Horses.)

New: There is a \$5.00/rider fee for entering in the Open Class Horse Events. This fee is not considered part of the membership fee or per entry fee that is required for all other Open Class entries nor is it required that an entry must be placed in any of the other Open Class areas.

OPEN CLASS ENTERING

Whether your talents lay with working with livestock or horses, photography, art work, art projects, craft items, woodworking, sewing, quilting, knitting and crocheting, gardening, canning, baking, or a multitude of other areas, you will find eight animal departments and 13 activities departments, over two-hundred and twenty divisions, and hundreds of classes from which to choose to highlight these talents.

In addition to the regular Open Class Departments in the Creative Activities areas that everyone may enter, there are separate divisions for seniors (55 and older) and for special living individuals (nursing home, group living arrangement individuals, etc.) along with the many Junior Divisions available that make it even easier to exhibit more of your items. The Artisan/Craftsman division in many departments is for those who fall between the Amateur and Professional definitions.

GENERAL TIPS

1. There are tips, definitions, and hints found throughout this book. Read them - use them.
2. In addition to the General Rules, be sure to follow all the rules that are listed under each department's heading.
3. Make sure your item is clean – no finger prints, loose strings, dirty or dusty, etc.
4. Be sure you have the most recent copy of the Fair Book.
5. With the exception of the Rabbits and Poultry Departments, only one entry per class per exhibitor is allowed. A set is considered one item.

Enter! Whether you win a ribbon or not – it is fun showing off your talent! And, you may surprise yourself!

HOW TO REGISTER

Basic Requirements: You must be a member of the Aitkin County Agricultural Society or pay \$1.00 per entry. With membership you will receive FREE UNLIMITED entries. (Horse Department excluded.) Memberships are available on entry days.

Cost: Single Person Membership - \$3.00; Family/Family Farm membership - \$5.00 {includes spouses, guardians, children 18 years (graduates from current year high school) and younger.} Family members will use the same membership number which will be assigned on Entry day. Special/Group Living Individual Membership - \$2.00 (Nursing home residents, special care/needs individuals, etc.). Every exhibitor must have their own exhibitor number. Any premiums awarded to an exhibit registered to that individual will be paid by check to that individual.

Family Farm exception: If the entries are exhibited under a Family Farm name more than one entry per class in the livestock areas is allowed. However, any premium check will be made out to the Farm not an individual. If an individual member of the Farm wishes to enter items (whether in the animals or activities areas) in his/her own name and meets the criteria for Family membership, the membership number of the Farm may be used at no further cost. If the individual does not meet the criteria, then \$1/entry or a single membership is needed.

Registration and Entry Days: The Monday evening before the opening day of the fair the Home Activities building will be open from 4:30 to 7:00 pm for those who have pre-registered and would like to pick up their tags and pay all memberships/fees before Tuesday's open-class activities entry day. Tagged items may then be just dropped off on Wednesday. All unused tags must be returned. Entries (pre-registered or not) may be brought in on Monday, but there will be very limited help available should you need assistance with your entries. Exhibitors who have pre-registered livestock may also pay their memberships or fees at this time.

Registration/Entry day for all Creative Activities

Open class items is on the Tuesday before the opening of the fair. On this day there will be help available to aid you in choosing the best area for your entry. Items are to be brought to the Home Activities Building between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm and must be in place by 5:15 pm, ready for judging. All entries must remain on display in the building until Saturday, 5:00 pm and must be picked up between 5:00 pm and 6:30 pm on Saturday. It is your responsibility to make arrangements to have them picked up during this time if you personally are unable to do so.

Registration/Entry day for open class horses and other livestock is on Wednesday.

Pre-registration: In addition to "same-day" registration there are three ways to preregister your items so that all the paperwork is done prior to bringing in your entries, lessening the time spent in lines and readying your entries on Tuesday or Wednesday. These options are available for all open class departments, with the exception of the Horse Department.

Required information: No matter which method or combination of methods for preregistration is used the following information is needed: Name, Address, Phone, Type (Single, Family, SpLv, or per entry). Optional helpful info requested for a Family or Special Living Individual is a "Group Name" or "Special Living Facility."

1. On-line Registration using the website

<https://aitkin.fairmanager.com>: If you are 95-100% sure you will be bringing in these items and there are less than 30 items per individual, this is a great way to go. Read the instructions carefully. Each exhibitor must have their own entry page and all the required information must be filled out. New passwords are needed every year. In the divisions where a "drop down" list for classes is used, just check the classes needed from the list. However, if a "label or description" is needed for a class – that one must be entered separately. You may return to your account at any time to add entries. But, if there are deletions you must notify us as aitkinctyfair@gmail.com so we may make the correction. On-line registration closes July 1 at 11 pm.

2. Register by e-mail at aitkinctyfair@gmail.com:

This method is the perfect choice for those registering more than 30 items or registering items that include flowers, hostas, photographs, bakery goods, vegetables, and other items that may or may not be ready for entry day. In addition to the information listed above be sure to list the department, division number and class number and any description as needed. If registering family members be sure to list entries under the correct person's name and attach list to the email.

3. Mail in Entry Form: Don't have a computer? This is the best option of preregistering for those who have 10 or more items. Fill out the entry form found in the Fair book and mail it to the address on the form. Mailed and e-mailed entries must be received by the Saturday before the opening day of the fair to assure completeness of the paperwork.

2021 Open Class Rules & Regulations for Exhibitors

1. The fairgrounds will be opened at 8:00 a.m. each day; the buildings open at 10:00 a.m. each day and close at 9:00 p.m.
2. All entries in Divisions "10" through "25" must be made in the Home Activities Building before 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday. All entries must be in place and ready for judging by 5:15 p.m. There will be no exceptions.
3. All livestock, and poultry entries must be made before 5:00 p.m. Wednesday with the appropriate department superintendent as follows: Sharon Dotzler & Lenore Jackson Cattle/Sheep/Swine; Lorelie Robinson: Poultry and Rabbits; and Becky Koch: Horses.
4. All exhibitors must have a membership or pay \$1/entry.
5. All persons entering in the Home Activities area are encouraged to enter online at <https://aitkin.fairmanager.com>. online registration will be available June 1 through July 1. Same day entering will still be available.
6. All exhibitors will be given a tag, if needed, containing division and class number which MUST be attached to or placed near the article or animal exhibited. All exhibitors should refer to the premium list to ensure the exhibit is properly tagged and entered.
7. Entries for premiums must be confined to the exhibit list.
8. An exhibitor may make only one entry in any given class with the exception of Poultry and Rabbits.
9. The Agricultural Society reserves the right to interpret the Rules and Regulations when differences relating to the Fair arise.
10. Awarding judges will not be permitted to exhibit and receive premiums on the class in which they shall act.
11. An exhibitor attempting to interfere with or influence the judges/ judging will be promptly excluded from the competition.
12. Great care must be taken to preserve the judges sheets and the awards must be entered in a plain legible manner, in proper place, as the premiums will be paid on these records. Sheets and tag numbers should be checked on prize entries.
13. The superintendent of the division shall keep a record of the awards made. The record, when completed, shall be signed and returned to the Secretary.
14. A blue ribbon or label will be attached to exhibits taking a first prize, a red ribbon or label to those taking second, and a white ribbon or label to those taking third prize.
15. Where there is no competition no first premium need be awarded. Only second or third as the judges decide. This will also apply to livestock exhibits.
16. Where there is but a single exhibitor in a division of any class or lot, the judge shall award but one premium, if warranted.
17. The Society will take every precaution in its power for the safe preservation of the stock and articles on exhibition after their arrival and arrangement on the grounds, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. Exhibitors are desired to give attention to their articles, and at the close of the Fair, Saturday at 5:00 p.m. to attend promptly to their removal.
18. No gambling devices, games of chance, or questionable attractions will be permitted upon the grounds. The Superintendent of Police and his assistants will preserve order and promptly arrest anyone disturbing the peace.

19. All Fair Buildings will be policed so that exhibits may be left until 5:00 p.m. Saturday.
20. The Fair Association reserves the right to prorrate the premium awards if receipts from the Fair demand it.
21. The Aitkin County Fair Board reserves the privilege of changing any of these Rules and Regulations to suit the purpose for which they have been made and to pass on their application regarding the Aitkin County Fair. The object of these Rules and Regulations being to make a better fair for all exhibitors and people involved.
22. Errors and omissions in printing decisions will be made by Superintendents.
23. All articles or animals entered for premium must be the property of the exhibitors. No exhibit shall be entered in the name of any other bona fide owner, and should any prove to be otherwise entered, premiums awarded to them will be forfeited to the society. Absolutely no exhibits may be removed from the fair grounds before 5:00 p.m., the last day of the fair, or all premiums and ribbons will be forfeited.
24. All dogs, with the exception of working/assistance dogs, are restricted from the fairgrounds during the County Fair.
25. Livestock buildings will be closed to spectators during judging and shows.
26. Campers in livestock area need heavy duty 50-type electrical cords.
27. No animals may be sold or given away on the fairgrounds.

5. "Commercially quilted" means that the quilt was given out to another person to finish. Therefore only the part of the quilt that was actually done by the exhibitor will be judged for an award.
6. If "Commercially quilted" was used, please give credit to the quilter or business of the quilted in the description section of the tag.
7. When using "Machine quilted", indicate whether a long-arm or regular sewing machine was used in the description section of the tag.

Pint or quart jars accepted.

Contest rules highlights include...

- All jars should be sealed with two-piece lids or one-piece approved lids. Jelly jars and paraffin wax are no longer recommended and will not be accepted.
- Leave screw bands on two-piece jar lids.
- No artificial food coloring should be added to entries.
- Approved current USDA canning methods must be used. All low-acid products must be processed in a pressure canner and boiling water bath is recommended for fruits and tomatoes. No open kettle processing. Current processing methods and times can be found at the website www.uga.edu/nchfp or call the University of Minnesota at 800-854-1678. Phone is answered by a Home Economist.
- Labels should be attached to each jar indicating the product, processing method including pressure if used and time processed.

• EXHIBITORS TO FURNISH THEIR OWN HAY

1. All Livestock entered for premiums must be halter broken and prepared to be shown, except the Beef Pen Class.
2. No riding west of livestock barns on fair grounds.
3. All exhibitors of livestock will be held responsible for all damage to property or people caused by unruly animals and shall indemnify the Agriculture Society and Management thereof against all legal and other proceedings arising there from.
4. Animals entered in group lots must be entered in individual lots.
5. All 4-H general livestock can exhibit in open class.
6. Exhibitors must obey the latest rules and regulations of the Minnesota Board of Animal Health governing public exhibition of livestock and poultry in Minnesota.
7. **GENERAL REQUIREMENTS** — Livestock and poultry that exhibit symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease, including ringworm and warts, may not be exhibited. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day they are admitted to the exhibition and at least once daily during the exhibition.
8. All Livestock must be pre-registered for stalling purposes. Pre-registration should be received at least two weeks prior to fair.
9. All Open Class Beef and Dairy will be released Friday at 5:00 pm to allow for the roll over for cattle coming in for the Saturday CMCA Beef Show.

Chairs may be in the alleyway only when in use.

- WSCA Rules apply for open class entries, judge's decision is final. Helmets encouraged, but not required. *These classes are NON-qualifying classes for WSCA Champ Show.
- Due to extremely limited parking in the livestock area, please plan to park trailers offsite if possible.

3. Only 2 entries in each lot such as 2 cockerel, 2 pullets, etc
4. Exhibits may not be removed from the show room until 5:00 pm the last day of the fair and the Fair Board will not be responsible after 5:00 pm the last day of the fair.
5. All exhibits will be under control of the superintendent and officers of the Association.
6. The Association will assure every possible precaution and care for the welfare of all birds but will not be responsible for any loss by accident, fire, disease, theft or other cause outside of its control.
7. Exhibitors are prohibited from handling each other's animals without permission of the owner or superintendent.
8. Birds can be entered in one class only. 4-H Club Members may also exhibit in Open Class with the same birds. All exhibits must be this year's hatch.
9. Cock-Male bird hatched prior to January 1st (not allowed). Hen-Female bird hatched prior to January 1st (not allowed). Cockerel-Male bird hatched after January 1st. Pullet-Female bird hatched after January 1st.
10. Judging will be done by comparison and according to the latest Standard of Perfection.
11. Exhibitors may place display cards or ribbons on coops only after awards are placed.
12. The Association shall have the right to prorate the premiums if it is found necessary. Premiums will be paid when the exhibits are removed on the last day of the fair.
13. Eggs laid during the show will become the property of the Association.
14. All standard varieties of chickens, turkeys, guinea fowl, duck and geese may be exhibited.
15. Judging of 4-H poultry will take place starting at 2:00 pm, Wednesday. 4-H poultry to be followed by open class. Order of judging is as follows: 4-H Chickens, Turkeys, and Waterfowl, then open Class Chickens, Turkeys, Waterfowl.
16. All chicken and turkey entries must have a health certificate or have pullorum testing done before being put in the poultry building. If you need pullorum testing done there will be a charge. Please contact Lorelie Robinson prior to the fair. Feed will be provided by the Association. Open class entries will be cared for by the Association. 4-H exhibits must be cared for by the exhibitor.

GENERAL RULES:

1. The rules for each Department are listed just below the Department headings. In addition, there are helpful hints pages to be found for the Vegetable, Art, and Photography Divisions.
2. Junior Divisions can be found in Floriculture, Clothing/Textiles, Art, Photography, Craft, Industrial Art/Crafts, and Baking Divisions in the Activities areas. It is highly recommended that an entry be placed in the correct age division where available. However, it is allowed to place an entry in an older age division or in the adult/general divisions should there be a need.
3. Make sure that each project is clean and presentable. Fingerprints, dirt marks, loose threads, etc. are reasons for deductions or disqualifications. Be sure to follow the department's rules.
4. If you are not sure where to place your entry (department, division, class), someone will be available on Tuesday to help you make the decision. You may enter as many classes as you wish but remember **ONLY ONE** item per class. A set is considered as one item.
5. Entries must remain on display until 5:00 pm, the last day of the fair. Early removal will result in forfeiture of any premium awarded. If you cannot pick up your own entries, make arrangements for another person to pick them up for you.
6. There is no limit to the number of entries an exhibitor may have. However, only one (1) entry per class number is allowed.
7. When there is no competition, no premium need be awarded. Premiums may be paid only on entries worthy of judging.
8. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor and have not been displayed and/or judged in any other department at the Aitkin County Fair. No professionals. Artisan/Craftsman divisions have been added in some departments for those who fall between the definitions of an Amateur and a Professional
9. Definitions: **a) Artisan/Craftsman** - One trained to manual dexterity or skill in a trade or one of the fine arts. They may receive compensation for teaching, consignment sales, requests, etc. as long as it does not rise to the professional status. **b) Amateur** - One who engages in a pursuit as a pastime because they have a taste or liking for something rather than expert knowledge or mastery of that pursuit. **c) Professional** - One who receives or makes a livelihood (a

means of support or subsistence) in an activity often engaged in by an amateur.

10. In addition to the Regular and Junior Divisions of Open Class which are designated with three digit Division numbers, divisions have been added for Special/Group Living Individuals, Senior Citizens (55 and over) and Artisan/Craftsman. These divisions are designated by four digit Division numbers. All Special Living divisions begin with a 3; the Senior divisions begin with a 4; and the Artisan/Craftsman divisions begin with a 5. Exhibitors who register in the Artisan/Craftsman divisions may not enter in any other open class division in their grouping.

2. Containers: Bottles will be provided for specimens except in the large stemmed varieties.
3. A commercial grower selling plants or flowers or a professional arranger may not exhibit for competition.
4. All flowers and plants in Classes 20 through 168 must be grown by the exhibitor.
 - a. Potted plants must be exhibited in the container in which grown for at least 3 months.
 - b. Containers not to exceed 12 inches in diameter.
 - c. Annuals must have been grown by exhibitor at least one month prior to exhibiting.
 - d. Hanging planter, terrariums and dish gardens must have been grown together for at least six weeks.
5. Exhibitor is required to follow schedule exactly as to the number of flowers, size, and material as specified.
6. Containers and accessories are entered at the owner's risk and should have name of exhibitor and address.
7. All arrangements and entries will be judged by a Horticultural Society certified judge.
8. The Agricultural Society will take every precaution possible to preserve the articles on display.

9. Wedging permitted.
10. Specimens must be shown with foliage except as noted.
11. This department contains a Junior Division section. Be sure to enter in the correct age division. It is allowed to place an entry in the adult division should there be a need.

Winning Suggestions

1. Collect flowers to be exhibited the evening before and place them in a pail of warm water (110 degrees). Set the pail in a cool place or refrigerator 12-24 hours.
2. Be sure to use a very sharp knife to cut the specimen blooms.
3. To exhibit, leave attached as much stem and as many leaves as possible.
4. Be sure no leaves are underwater.
5. Check for dirt, bugs and discoloration on the leaf underside.
6. Remove excess blossoms close to the stem, leaving no knobs.

Karen Newton (218-851-2814) - Superintendent

Exhibits in this department are considered two-dimensional art works. Two-dimensional art has width and height, no depth, and is typically presented on an uniformly flat or nearly flat surface. The impression of depth is an illusion created by the use of color and shading.

Painting and Drawing are the two-dimensional art areas considered in this department. The paintings and drawings are usually done on flat surfaces such as stretched canvases, canvas boards, drawing paper, etc.

The art project divisions/classes allow for painting/drawings on different surfaces or structures. However, even though the surface may enhance the appearance of the art work, it is the artwork that is judged in this department - not the entire piece

DEFINITIONS FOR BEDCOVERS AND QUILTS

Applique – An applique is a small decorative piece added to a quilting block or a completed quilt. An applique involves embroidering on or sewing pieces of fabric together to create designs or images on a background square or quilt by hand or machine. The appliques, then, are sewn to quilts by hand or using a machine.

Backing – A quilt backing is a large piece of fabric, either one seamless piece or two or three strips of fabric seamed together, attached to the top of the quilt. The backing holds in the quilt batting and covers the seams that hold the quilt blocks together.

Batting – Batting is a layer of fiber between the backing and quilt top. It offers warmth, softness, and texture to the quilt.

Hand Quilting – Hand quilting is the process of sewing together the elements of the quilt by hand with a running stitch that is made through all the layers of the quilt to hold it together. Hand quilters often use quilting frames or hoops to stabilize their work. The finish of a hand quilt is softer and looks more traditional.

Long-arm Quilting – Long-arm quilting uses a long-armed, typically 10 to 14 feet long, sewing machine to stitch together the quilt top, batting, and backing. The length of the arm allows the finishing of a project more quickly and moves freely to perform a manual (free-motion) or preprogrammed quilting design.

Machine Quilting – A machine quilt is a quilt sewn using a sewing machine to piece together the quilt blocks and to stitch together the quilt top, batting, and backing. It may also be used for free-motion quilting. As opposed to a hand quilt, the stitches may have a more even and precise finish.

Piecing – Piecing is the process of creating quilt blocks by sewing together pieces of fabric in a pattern. It can be as simple as sewing together squares of fabric or involve more complicated shapes and techniques such as strip piecing, English paper piecing, foundation paper piecing, or Trapunto which adds a puffy layer to the top of the quilt top.

Tied Quilting – A tied quilt is where instead of stitching in a quilting pattern to hold the three layers of the quilt together a series of ties or knots are used. They are spaced evenly all over the body of the quilt. Thick bedcovers are often tied rather than quilted (sewn).

Wholecloth Quilting – Wholecloth quilts are created by sandwiching a solid quilt top, batting and backing together as opposed to a patchwork (block) quilt top. A wholecloth quilt can be made from a special fabric or to showcase free motion or Trapunto sewing techniques. Wholecloth quilts are often used as bedcovers.

Hints, Definitions & Functional Tips for Entering Art/Photography

Composition – Framing and choice of viewpoint - Applicable to both Art and Photography

Proper composition holds the viewer in the image and prompts the viewer to look where the creator intends. Here are the most common composition techniques:

- Close up
- Framing (doorways, window, trees, etc.)
- Rule of Thirds (think tic, tac, toe and hit the crossings)
- Angle (get above or below the subject – not eye level)

Lighting – Applicable to both Art and Photography – The use and control of light refers to how dimension, shape, and roundness are defined in an image. Whether the light is man-made or natural, proper use of lighting should enhance an image.

Focus – Applicable to both Art and Photography – Sharpness/depth should be well defined; showing sharpness where needed and less definition where it is not. In photography it will show the proper use of the camera so that the photograph is focused correctly.

Finish – Applicable to both Art and Photography – Give the artwork/print a finished look. The mats, borders, and framing should support and enhance the image – not distract from it.

Definitions – Mainly applicable to Art projects – Realistic: Recognizable subject matter; Abstract: Imagery consists only of Elements of Art such as Line, Shape, Color/Value, Texture, and Space/Form

Exposure – Mainly applicable for Photography – Does the exhibitor show proper exposure and how proper exposure insures correct color and overall brightness?

Special Effects – Applicable to Photography - The use of Photoshop filters, etc. must create obvious effects that significantly alter original image and enhances subject matter or composition.

Functional Tips – Applicable to both Art and Photography

All pictures must be mounted on a suitable backing or framed. Works on paper which are not in frames (Drawings, Watercolors, Photography, etc.) should have backing for strength and encased in plastic (See “Easy Tip” below) to protect art from the environment and/or damage.

All frames should have either wire or saw-tooth hanger for hanging or be able to stand alone. Art created on canvas which is not framed, while not required, should have small eye hooks and wire attached on back for hanging.

Follow all rules of the individual department.

Easy Tip – Use the same plastic film you shrink wrap your windows with during the winter. Place your paper/art on a backing (cardboard, matting, foamboard, etc.) Cut plastic wrap to size as if you were wrapping a present. Wrap art & backing with plastic. Use tape provided with plastic to adhere all together or other double stick tape. Use a hair dryer to shrink the plastic around art.

DEPARTMENT 14 - PHOTOGRAPHY

Sara Rian - Superintendent

1. See General rules.
2. **All photos must be 4"x 6" or larger and mounted on a suitable 5"x 7" or larger backing or be framed.** A 4"x 6" photo in a 4"x 6" frame will be accepted. Construction paper IS NOT considered a suitable backing. Suitable backings include poster board, cardboard, or foam board. It is also recommended that they have hangers attached or be able to stand alone. (Needed for displaying photos properly)
3. Judging will be based on Composition, Lighting, Exposure, Focus, Special Effects (digital/cell) and Finish.
4. If you wish to protect the surface of your project, frame it under glass or cover with a clear plastic wrap.
5. "Cropping" or "Enlarging" are the only computer manipulations allowed in the Black/White or Colored Film divisions. If any other manipulation or enhancing has been done on the computer, the photo must be entered in the digital divisions.
6. In the Miscellaneous Photo Projects, the "Photo-Shopped" photo must be a combination of 2 or more sources. Attach copies of the original sources to the back of the photo to aid in the judging.

Superintendent

To assist the gardener in selecting and preparing vegetables for exhibit, the following suggestions are made:

BEETS, CARROTS, PARSNIPS, TURNIPS, RUTABAGAS: Root crops

should be mature but not over grown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops trimmed off 1 1/4" above the crown. Side roots trimmed off but not the tap root. Clean by brushing.

BROCCOLI: Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5" from top of head.

CABBAGE: Stems cut about 1/2" below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves. Leave few wrapper leaves.

CAULIFLOWER: Heads should be white, compact and free of small leaves and ricy texture. Stems cut so as to leave 4 to 6 leaves. Outer leaves trimmed to 1-2" above the white head. Use soft bristled brush to remove dirt from head.

CELERY: Remove roots of stalk and trim butt to form a triangle for pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on outside until color is uniform.

CUCUMBERS: Pickling select fruits 3-5" long. Specimens should be same stage of maturity and uniform in size, shape and color. Slicers-select fruits that are straight, dark green and 6-10" long. They should be uniform in size, shape and color. Leave stems attached. Soft brush clean.

EGGPLANT: Uniform in color and free from bronzing and greening. Stem should be left on.

KOHLRABI: Roots removed just below the ball. Remove all but the center 4-6 leaves. Select specimens that are uniform, medium size and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumbnail. They should be clean but not washed.

MUSKMELON: Select fruit that separate easily from the vine. Melons should be mature but not overripe.

ONIONS: Have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give a slick appearance. Only such outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform length of 1/2". Wipe or brush but do not wash. Cut tops 1 to 1-1/2 inches long.

PEAS: Select bright green well filled with seeds, the best eating stage. Do not wash as bloom should be preserved.

PEPPERS: Stem should be left 1/2 -1" long.

RADISHES: Tap root cut 1/2" and tops cut to 1/2".

RHUBARB: Select stalks that are straight, uniform and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Cut off blade leaf 2" above the stalk.

SNAP BEANS: Harvest before constrictions appear between seeds, when seeds are about half grown. Pods should be wiped clean but not washed. Leave stems attached.

SUMMER SQUASH: Select small size fruit when rind is soft and easily punctured with thumbnail. Leave about 1/2" of stem and wipe fruits clean.

TABLE ONIONS: Peeled roots, trimmed tops, cut uniform 6-8".

TOMATOES: Uniform size, shape and color. Leave 1/2" stem on. Fruits should be uniformly shaped and free of cracks and blemishes.

WATERMELONS: Select fruit that are mature but not overripe. Leave 1 inch of stem on.

5. The right to open any jar is granted judges if there is any question regarding its canning merits.

6. All canning entries must be exhibited in one-pint jars unless otherwise specified.
7. Approved current USDA canning methods must be used. All low-acid products must be processed in a pressure canner and boiling water bath is recommended for fruits and tomatoes. No open kettle processing. Current processing methods and times can be found at the website www.uga.edu/nchfp or call the University of Minnesota at 800-854-1678. Phone is answered by a Home Economist.
8. Labels should be attached to each jar indicating the product, processing method, including pressure if used and time processed.

5. Fair staff and/or judges reserve the right to combine classes and to move any bottle that is entered in the wrong class. If that class has already been judged, the bottle will not be in contention.
6. Must obtain at least 40 points to be eligible for a blue ribbon; 30 points to eligible for a red; and 20 points for a white. Eligibility does not mean awarded.

DIVISION 400 - BEER

1. Beer may be made from malts, hops, grains, fruit/vegetable juice or any other product commonly used in making beer.
2. Each entry must be bottled in a standard 10 - 16 oz. beer bottle. (Preferences are for no raised-glass, printed caps and brand name lettering blacked out.)
3. Each bottle must be labeled with a description of the beer and exhibitors must bring two bottles per entry.
4. Judging will be on Bouquet/Aroma appropriate for style - 10 pt., Appearance (color, clarity, head retention) - 6 pts, Flavor including aftertaste and balance - 25 pts, Body (full/thin) as appropriate for style - 4 pts, and Overall Drinkability/Impression - 5 pts.
